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DEPARTMENT EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES Baltimore, Maryland August 30, 2015

President Sharon Cherrette called the meeting to order at 9:15 AM at the Hilton Baltimore Hotel in the American Legion, Department of Alaska Hospitality Suite. Because we did not have enough Units present for a quorum, it was decided to go ahead and begin hearing Pre-Convention Committee reports while we waited for Sue Diaz to arrive. Her presence would give us the needed Unit for a quorum.

Committee Reports

Children and Youth and Liaison to Child Welfare Foundation; Past President's Parley – Penny Mazonna

There were no awards and only one amendment to the National Standing Rules presented that would be discussed at the Constitution and Bylaws committee meeting. The amendment that was presented would rename the Cavalcade of Memories Committee to National History Committee and add the National Historian as ex-officio member.

There were two proposed resolutions by the Department of Maryland that were dismissed on the advice of The American Legion Judge Advocate Onderdunk because they are unconstitutional so no action can be taken on them. The first resolution would require Advance Notice of Proposed National Appointments and the second resolution would give Departments the option to "opt out" of the Electronic Renewal Advice to its members from dues Notices.

There were only five candidates submitted for National Woman of the Year for 2015.

Cavalcade of Memories and Poppy – Colleen Newman

Cavalcade of Memories – no awards and the amendment tabled until Constitution and Bylaws. There was a survey circulated. Please see attached.

Poppy – No awards or citations for the Department of Alaska. No resolutions or amendments. The one good piece of information is that Emblem Sales has come up with a way to solve the problem of the poppy labels not sticking. The labels will now be perforated with three small holes so that the stem can be threaded through the labels.

Americanism, Education, Community Service – Marge Blankenship Americanism – No awards, no resolutions.

Education – No awards, no resolutions.

Community Service – No awards, no resolutions.

Membership – Sue Waldhaus

There was one resolution regarding funding for the second phase of the strategic plan - \$1,000,000. No awards for Alaska. The Department of Alaska was on the low end of the award spectrum but that was a trend experienced nationally – there were a number of possible awards that no one won. Million member push-one major point is to grow the leadership.

Public Relations, Auxiliary Emergency Fund and Leadership – Connie Kullander Public Relations – No awards, no resolutions.

Auxiliary Emergency Fund – No awards, no resolutions. There was \$150,000 in grants available. Only five grants awarded in disaster grants.

Leadership – No awards, no resolutions. More mentorship for new members suggested.

Chaplains and Historians – Barbe Wolkoff Chaplains – No awards, no resolutions.

Historians – No awards, one amendment as discussed in Penny Mazonna's report and that was brought up in Constitution and Bylaws renaming the Cavalcade of Memories Committee to the History Committee.

National Security and Legislative – Lori Fruhwirth

National Security – 100% reporting. No awards or resolutions. National will be promoting the ementoring program next year.

Legislative – No awards or resolutions. Lori signed up on the Legislative counsel.

Credentials and Rules – Linda Schmitt

Credentials - 800 delegates total. No 2/3 or ½ count any longer due to the use of the keypads and every vote being counted.

Rules – There is one rules change to Rule Number 24on Page 131 of your Convention Guide under the Proposed Convention Standing Rules. The Rule now reads: The National Parliamentarian with the approval of the National President, National Vice President, National Secretary, and National Treasurer, is authorized to correct article and section designations, punctuation, and crossreferences, and to make such technical and conforming changes as may be necessary to reflect the intent of the voting delegates in connection with the revision considered at this convention."

The change is as follows:

Please strike the words "the revision considered" in the very last line of the rule. Insert "any amendments to the governing documents adopted".

The last line Rule 24 will now read "...intent of the voting delegates in connection with any amendments to the governing documents adopted at this convention."

Finance and Foundation – Lisa Williamson

Finance – There was one resolution presented for finance, there is \$494,000 that is being carried over from the first year of the Centennial Strategic Plan and National is requesting an additional \$496,000 for a total of nearly \$1,000,000 to fund the second year of the plan through 2017. The finance committee recommended the adoption of this funding. The recommendation was passed unanimously.

Foundation – The Foundation is introducing their connections with #GivingTuesday that is held around the world in the month of November and also their new collaboration with Amazon Smile. The Foundation is also announcing a new corporate American Legion Auxiliary Credit Card through USAA.

VA&R – Sharon Cherrette

VAVS Reps and Deps Report – Sue Caswell, VAVS Honorary Life Member; Marge Blankenship, VAVS Representative and Marjorie Noble, VAVS Deputy. The Auxiliary does their report 1 April through 31 March. The annual report for the Auxiliary is every November. If Auxiliary members were to be paid an hourly wage for their volunteer hours, they would make \$22.55 per hour. Since 1960 that equates to 6.8 million dollars and 7.7 million hours donated in time! No awards, no resolutions.

The Quilts of Valor project was introduced.
