
Saarinen secured the War Memorial Center (WMC) commission in 1950. Most notably, he served in **The Office of Strategic Services (OSS)** during World War II (WWII) where he operated as *Chief of the Special Exhibits Section of the Presentation Division*.

Among many of Saarinen's prolific accomplishments include the design and construction of the:

Community Project Item 1:

At the front of the War Memorial Center there are six (6) solid, red granite barriers put in place as decorative vehicle obstacles. Five represent each branch of the service, the sixth has the name of the memorial and a quote from General Douglas MacArthur.




<u>Community Project Item 1</u>: Each granite block will be power sprayed in advance, however the painted areas of each logo and text will need to be touched up with black paint.

Paint and paint brushes will be provided however, we will need individuals willing to fill in the areas that previously had black paint in the various branch of service logo and lettering.

Casual attire that can potentially get paint should be worn along with comfortable shoes. Work gloves will be provided. All work will be done on ground level working from the concrete surfaces.



Community Project Item 2: Polish black marble surfaces. This will include the surface area around the eternal flame and eight black marble benches located in Veterans Courtyard. Windex glass cleaner and towel recommended by experts.

<u>Community Project Item 2</u>: Each marble surface will be power sprayed. Stone / marble experts will be in attendance to provide guidance. Work gloves will be provided. All work will be done on ground level working from the concrete surfaces.

<u>Community Project Item 3</u>: The War Memorial Center secured funding in 2020 to build out green infrastructure, including native plantings along the north lot of the building. This is an area that tends to collect debris and will require some weeding to preserve the native plantings associated with the project. This is an area where we can use some help removing late summer, unwanted weeds and removing trash that may be blown in and collected in the prairie grass area.

<u>Community Project Item 4</u>: North of the native plantings area is the Vietnam War Memorial. Bricks are placed around the memorial with names of Veterans engraved in the tiles. Power-spraying and removing debris lifted out from between bricks would be required. A leaf blower will also be provided to help blow away the debris. The use of water with the power-sprayer will result in the users getting splash via the equipment.



> The promenade to the Vietnam Memorial, through the native prairie contemplative garden, is fully permeable, capturing and treating stormwater runoff onsite.
> In addition to managing runoff, the cobble storn water channel provides a visible connection between stormwater runoff native plants, and the lake for visitors.
> The native prairie plants throughout the site provide habitat for essential pollinators and a respite for migratory birds.
